

**Exum to Smith (James Exum to Colonel Laurence Smith)
Written July 26, 1810 – Registered June Court 1811**

This indenture made the twenty sixth day of July, 1810. Between James Exum of the one part and Laurence Smith of the other part. Witnesseth that the said James Exum for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred dollars to him in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted bargained sold and released and by these presents doth grant bargain sell and release to the said Laurence Smith his heirs and assigns forever a tract or parcel of land lying on the Mill Swamp in Northampton County and containing by estimate two hundred acres be the same more or less being the land formerly belonging to John Low & John Seate and adjoining the lands of Smith, Fulgham, Taylor and others which it more fully appears to have and to hold all and singular the above described premises to him the said Laurence Smith his heirs and assigns forever and the said James Exum doth covenant and agree with the said Laurence Smith to warrant and defend the right and title of the above described land to him his heirs and assigns forever against all person or persons whatsoever claiming or to claim the whole or any part thereof.
