

Deed to Cum Fund

I call to whom this present writing shall come, Joseph Cum of Northampton County since deceased, know ye that the said Joseph Cum as well for me as in consideration of the Natural Love and affection which I have and do bear unto by well beloved son Joseph Cum as for Divers other good causes and benevolence me hereunto moving have given and granted and by these presents do fully clearly and absolutely give grant and confirm unto the said Joseph Cum all and singular as such my goods and chattles, Implements of house hold and common necessaries as are contained and specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed. One Part of Land whereon he now lieth containing five hundred and forty Acres more or less my Negro Boy named Samson one Negro Boy named London one Negro Girl named Frederick one Girl named Phoebe and all the house hold goods found that you the said Plantation to him and his heirs forever To have and to hold all and singular the said goods chattles Implements of house hold and common necessaries whatsoever as aforesaid to the aforesaid Joseph Cum his Heirs and assigns to his and their own proper use and behoof forever therefore and thereafter to be used and disposed of at his and their wills and pleasure as if he and they were the owners proper goods & chattles without any manner of challenge from or Demand of me the said Joseph Cum or of my Heirs or assigns after me in any manner by my cause or Default and yetther know ye

That the said Joseph Cum have paid unto the said Joseph Cum in full payment of all and singular the aforesaid premises by the Delivery unto him at the said Plantation of one hundred of Gold in the name of the whole In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this sixteenth day of December and in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and fifty eight Signed Sealed and Delivered in presence of
