cow & Calf during her life or widowhood
- in I give and bequeath unto my son Robert Snipes
all my land and plantation also One dark One
hundred dollars also One Roof better to him and his
heirs forever
- in I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter
Impudence Hall One negro girl named
Noah and her heirs forever
- in I give and bequeath unto my grandson William
Howell One negro boy above the hair and his
heirs forever —

Item I give and bequeath unto Robert Snipes the
son of Robert Snipes One negro boy Harry
to him and his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath unto Robert Snipes the
son of Robert Snipes one negro girl Noah to him
and his heirs forever

Item I leave unto my blood sister Mary Howell One
negro woman named Anna during her widowhood
or life word of the her marriage or deceased to be
sold and equally divided among my children to
them and their heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath unto my grandson Robert
Baptist Three Dishes and Three plates to him
and his heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter
Alice Boykin three dishes and three plates to
her and her heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Robert Crisp
one pair of standards to have and his heirs forever
Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter
Mary Russell two pound current money of England
to her and her heirs forever

Item I have unto my beloved wife Mary Crisp
my old small mare during her life or widowhood
and my desire is that the goods that I have
left unto my wife that after her marriage or death
should be sole and equally divided among my
children and also the remainder part of my
estate that I have not given away to be sold
and equally divided among my children
to them and their heirs forever and I do
constate and affirm Robert Crisp and
Lawrence Smith my late and sole executors
of this my last will and testament and Resolving
and determining all making void all other
wills herebefore made by me in contraries
Wherefore I have caused to set my hand and
seal my seal there to day of my hand anno 1774
